| <b>Application Fee:</b>                                   | \$150 per student, payable with new student application, and is <u>non-refundable</u> .   |
| <b>Testing Fee:</b>                                       | For students who may need further assessment to determine eligibility for matriculation, a testing fee of \$100 per student is required.  |
| <b>Enrollment Fee:</b>                                    | \$225 per family each year, payable at registration, and is <u>non-refundable</u> . This fee reserves your student's placement. A discounted fee is available for returning families that register their student(s) during the Early Re-enrollment Period.  |
| <b>Supplemental Deposit:</b><br>(Secondary students only) | <u>Refundable</u> deposit of \$2,000 charged one-time in the first year of enrollment for new students. The deposit will be used toward elective and ancillary fees incurred by the student throughout the course of their enrollment at King's. Unused balances will be applied to the next academic year or refunded if the student does not return or upon graduation. |
| <b>K-12 Building Fee:</b>                                 | \$435 per student, up to a maximum of \$1,305 per family, for maintenance and improvements on our campus. This annual fee is not pro-rated for late enrollment or any withdrawal/dismissal.   |
| <b>Senior Fee:</b>  | <u>Non-refundable</u> fee of \$300 charged at the beginning of the Senior Year for senior class activities.   |

### Tuition

King's tuition is an annual rate covering the entire school year.

**Cancellation, Withdrawal, and Late Enrollment:** Written notice of enrollment cancellation must be received and confirmed by the School on or before August 1<sup>st</sup>. A minimum charge equal to 10% of the annual tuition will be due for enrollment cancellations received thereafter until the first day of the school year. Once the school year has begun, tuition is pro-rated by 9-week academic terms (quarter) for withdrawals or late enrollments. Enrollment during any part of a quarter requires payment of tuition for the **entire** quarter. The balance of tuition & other fees are due in full at the time of withdrawal.

### Payment Options

Complete payment of the annual tuition and building fee is **due in full by August 15<sup>th</sup>**. All other charges of extended care fees, elective course fees, optional activity fees, and other charges are billed monthly on the 15<sup>th</sup> and due as incurred throughout the school year, unless otherwise noted on the fee schedule. As part of the enrollment process, families will register with Smart Tuition, who manages King's billing and payments.

- International student families must enroll in the 1-Payment Plan during registration.
- Payments to Smart Tuition may be made by check, credit card, or direct bank debit. Families wishing to pay by wire transfer must still enroll with Smart Tuition, but will make wire transfer payment directly to King's Schools. Wire transfer payments require prior authorization from the School Bookkeeper. - All amounts payable are stated in U.S. Dollars
- No tuition discounts apply for international students.
- For late enrollments, full payment of tuition and building fee is due within 30 days of enrollment.

### Extended Care and Transportation

**King's Elementary** offers extended care through King's Kids Club (KKC). K-6 students are automatically registered in KKC for before/after-school care. Student care is billed at an hourly rate of \$10.50, based on actual usage, unless a package option has been selected. Please contact KKC for information on monthly packages.

**Transportation Fee** - King's bus service is available in many areas for an additional fee. Daily round-trip service is \$1,500 (billed monthly at \$150 for 10 months). Daily one-way service is \$1,150 (billed monthly at \$115 for 10 months). Rates are per individual rider. ### Additional Optional Fees

King's strives to make our tuition inclusive and does not have extra charges for textbooks, supplies, field trips, and many of the special programs and activities that enrich our students' learning experience. However, additional fees are assessed for some of King's elective courses, interscholastic athletics, and competitive activities (i.e. Mock Trial, DECA, and Robotics). The course fees help to cover expenses in excess of normal and customary costs for specialized course materials or travel required for the elective course. Athletic and activity fees help offset the extra costs for equipment, officials, and travel for competitions at the local and state level.

<sup>1</sup> Additional fees may be incurred for students choosing to participate in solo and ensemble competitions or auditioning for All-Northwest (High School students). Please consult the course instructor for more details.

**NOTE for Living Faith and KHS Live:** Participation in the group mission trip is required. Costs of the mission trip will be determined in the fall and payment due dates will be scheduled between January and March. Living Faith and KHS Live mission trips generally cost between \$1,200 and \$2,500 per participant. A non-refundable \$250 deposit for this trip is collected in the fall by the school.

<sup>2</sup> Participants may incur additional athletic expenses for items such as personal equipment, shoes, pictures, clothing, off-season camps, physicals, and extended team travel. Coaches will communicate these costs in advance to families as they arise.

Other optional activities may be offered throughout the year for a fee. Fees for these activities will be communicated in advance. Examples of past activities are: ASB/Leadership retreats, Ashland Shakespeare Festival Trip, Spring Break Mission Trips, DECA Conferences, Robotics National Championship, and other student club activities.
